### NHS Health Check – Et Al Training

### **Course details:**

We set the current national scene for NHS Health Checks fairly briskly and then go on to explain the whole underlying principle of cardiovascular disease and its development and prevention.

In a practical manner we proceed through each aspect of the data required to complete a health check and clarify the relevance. From date of birth, pulse, through to the blood results, we lay each out with the what, why and how for health checks. Explanations to the individual receiving a health check is vital, so descriptions are offered which are memorable and useful for the conversation, which accompanies any health check. The concept of "risk" is tricky and so we have a chance to sit back and think about this and the messages we give to people.

We explain dementia. We utilise GPPAQ and Audit C which can be powerful tools for lifestyle change if understood and used effectively

# Foundations of Contraception, Reproduction and Sexual Healthcare (CRASH) - University of Bolton

- Critically analyse the key concepts associated with delivering ethical, safe and effective contraceptive, reproductive and sexual health care.


- There is a requirement to undertake and pass the Online Theory Assessment (OTA) -This requires study time.

- Offer a 30 min teams call called 'Intro to the Online theory Assessment' where a member of the NTSP (Nexplanon Training Support Team) will run through the requirements for the OTA, where to register for it etc
- Support with the OTA We have two digital nurses who can assist in supporting HCP's while they prepare for the OTA.
- Practical Training The NTSP can undertake the practical training of the HCP in their practice and sign them off, on the day they undertake model arm and live clinical training.
- Follow up support at 1 month, 3 months and 6 months post training.


