Motivational Interviewing – Et al training

Course details:

If you spend your life explaining what your service users should, could, must or need to do then this is the course for you.

Motivational interviewing is a style of communication that uses a guiding/reflective style to engage with people, clarify their strengths and aspirations, and utilise their own motivations for change, and promote independence of decision making.

What's the result?

- Gain an overview of an effective alternative to trying to be persuade people to change their behaviour.
- Gain an appreciation of how people can use their own motivations and find their solutions for behaviour change.
- Tune our listening from "to be understood." into "listening to understand".
- Discover how questions, reflections, affirmations and summaries can be used to facilitate a more effective conversation about behaviour change.
- Observe how reflective listening can help when people's emotions are running high.

Virtual Women's Health

- Be able to recognise the common causes of 'bleeding' problems and gain an understanding of the relevant investigations and management in primary care.
- Understand the causes of polycystic ovary syndrome and fertility problems, the investigations and support to be offered and when referral is indicated.
- Be able to support women with urinary incontinence by recognising the causes, supporting with lifestyle advice, and knowing when to refer.
- Appreciate the various types of prolapse and ways to manage in primary care.
- Understand the 5 different gynae cancers including appreciating risk factors, how they present, and referral recommendations and pathways.

- Appreciate the need for emergency contraception and the recommendations of each option.
- Understand the common infections, sexually transmitted and non-sexually transmitted.
- Know where to signpost for further information and where/when to refer.

Virtual Introduction to Menopause

•Be able to support women who are wanting advice about management of their perimenopause.

•Be able to undertake a repeat HRT appointment.

•Provide lifestyle advice to optimise health and wellbeing of post-menopausal women.

•Know where to signpost for further information and where/when to refer.


