

About this course

This course helps learners to gain a solid understanding of acquired brain injuries, how to maintain mental well-being and prevent mental health challenges. Learners will develop skills to improve collaboration among colleagues to create a supportive work environment, explore factors affecting mental well-being and learn strategies to promote mental health actively. An insight into various forms of sensory loss and their impact will be explored, and practical skills for adapting communication to support individuals with sensory loss. What are the units/modules involved?

- Module 1: Understand Mental Well-Being and Mental Health Promotion

- Module 3: Understand The Impact of Acquired Brain Injury on Individuals
- Module 4 Understand Sensory Loss

How will the course be delivered?

It will be delivered online with face-to-face observations.

How long does the course take?

It will take around 15 weeks to complete.

Who is eligible for this course?

- Learners must either live OR work within Greater Manchester
- Learners must be employed and actively involved in a care service.
- Do not currently possess a Level 3 Diploma in Adult Care.
- Learners should ideally have a minimum of Level 2 in Literacy and Numeracy or equivalent
- Learner must be aged 16 or above

- Explore factors affecting mental well-being and learn strategies to promote positive mental health actively.
- Understand how to maintain mental well-being and prevent mental health challenges.

- Learn empathetic support strategies for those facing mental health issues.
- Learners will gain a comprehensive understanding of acquired brain injuries and their effects.
- Gain practical skills for adapting communication to support individuals with sensory loss.

The portfolio may include assignments, workbooks, and documentation from onsite practical observations, allowing learners to demonstrate their evidence effectively.
