## The Trainee Nursing Associate role

- Bridging role between healthcare support workers and registered nurses.
- Working independently under the direct and indirect supervision of the Registered Nurse.
- Working with people of all ages in a variety of settings in health and social care.
- Nursing Associate Foundation Degree Level 5.
- Provides progression route into graduate level nursing.

## **Essential entry** criteria

- Be employed, working a minimum of 30 hours per week.
- Level 2 Functional Skills in English and Maths or GCSE English Language and Maths at Grade A-C or 4-6.
- Experience working within healthcare.
- Have the indefinite right to live and work in the UK with no restrictions.



### The programme content

- 2-year programme of study at the University of Salford or University of Bolton.
- Attend the equivalence of university 1 day a week for academic study (7.5hours).
- Work 3 days a week clinically under the guidance of a practice supervisor (22.5hours).
- Spend 20% off the job learning each week.
- Includes a primary care specific element.
- On successful competition of the TNA Foundation Degree the Nursing Associate will register with NMC.

#### **Funding**

- The funding offered by NHS England is a total of £8,000. This is paid to the employer over four instalments of £2,000 across the duration of the course.
- The apprenticeship levy of £15,000 can be accessed to fund course fees arranged by levy transfer.
