About this course

This course helps learners to gain in-depth knowledge of acquired brain injuries, different learning disabilities, and their effects. You will develop an understanding of Autistic Spectrum Conditions and how to effectively support and promote the well-being of individuals with Autistic Spectrum Conditions. Learners will also gain knowledge in various forms of sensory loss and their impact, as well as practical skills for adapting communication to support individuals with sensory loss. How will the course be delivered?

It will be delivered online with face-to-face observations.

How long does the course take?

It will take around 20 weeks to complete.

Who is eligible for this course?

- Learners must either live OR work within Greater Manchester
- Learners must be employed and actively involved in a care service.
- Do not currently possess a Level 3 Diploma in Adult Care.
- Learners should ideally have a minimum of Level 2 in Literacy and Numeracy or equivalent
- Learner must be aged 16 or above

- Develop an understanding of Autistic Spectrum Conditions, recognising unique characteristics and challenges.
- Gain a comprehensive understanding of acquired brain injuries and their effects.
- Learn person-centred approaches to provide tailored and effective support for individuals with learning disabilities.

- Acquire skills to create inclusive environments that support the diverse needs of individuals with learning disabilities.
- Personal growth through fostering understanding and effective support practices.

How will learning be assessed?
